

RULES AND REGULATIONS

SECTION II – ENTRIES

1. Every article or animal upon the ground will be under control of the Board of Directors. The Association will have watchmen, or police on duty both day and night. While the Association provides this precautionary measure for protection of all exhibits and articles brought on the grounds it will not be responsible for loss, injury, vandalism, or damage by fire, lightning, wind, or any other agency to such animal or article an exhibition or display, and upon which condition all entries are accepted.
2. Exhibitors must place all exhibits under the direction of the superintendents in charge, or in the event of his absence, under the direction of the secretary of manager. When space has been allotted to an exhibitor the Board of Directors reserves the right, in case such exhibitor shall fail to make or maintain a creditable display, to declare the space allotted to him or any portion therefore forfeited.
3. No animal or article shall compete for more than one premium unless specified in the premium list.
4. All produce exhibited must be grown by the exhibitor and all manufacturers competing for premiums must have been made by the exhibitor or his employees.
5. Application for entries in all departments must be made on the printed form provided for that purpose, which may be obtained free by addressing the manager. They must be in full compliance with the printed instructions on same. The right is reserved to reject any entry offered.
6. All entries must be made in the name of the bonafide owner or owners, actual growers, or producers, inventors or manufacturers. **Livestock – Market Livestock is the only livestock that the exhibitor must be the owner.**
7. In case of joint ownership only one exhibitor's ticket will be issued and any member of this Association may exhibit for competition in the open classes by purchasing an exhibitor's ticket.
8. Entries in the various departments close on the following dates: Livestock - Tuesday midnight of week preceding the Fair. All other open class exhibits – Tuesday, July 27, 10 a.m.
9. Any person using deception on entering any animal or article shall not be awarded any premium, and shall be debarred from exhibiting for the period of three years.
10. 4-H Club and Smith-Hughes members may show breeding animals or produce and agricultural exhibit only in open class by purchasing an exhibitor's ticket at regular prices.

11. The Fair reserves the right to refuse any entry after space has been filled.
12. All exhibitor and participants must sign the consent form. Minors must have written consent from signed by parents or guardians in order to enter 4-H, FFA, or Open Class. Forms are available at the office.
13. All entries accepted only on the theory that exhibitors and participants have read and agree to be bound by all rules and regulations of the Huron Community Fair Association.
14. Entries will be taken on a first-come basis.
15. Each exhibitor must have liability insurance.
