

SECTION V – LIVESTOCK

1. All animals for exhibition must be free from contagious infections, or communicable disease. Approved health certificates are required.
2. The Board of Directors reserves the right to refuse admission of any animal or animals originating from a herd whenever the status of health of the entire herd is questionable or suspicious.
3. Health papers must be presented to officers in charge before animals may be unloaded.
4. All applications for stalls and pens must be noted on entry blank at time for filing. Exhibitor must indicate on the entry blank the number of animals they will show.
5. Stalls and pens will not be supplied with straw for first bedding. Exhibitors will be permitted to bring onto the grounds feed and bedding up to 10 a.m. but the management reserves the right to refuse admission of such, if in their judgment there is an excessive amount. The space in the barns is for exhibition purposes and not for storage of the feed or bedding.
6. 4-H horse show on Monday, open class and 4-H FFA dairy show on Tuesday, draft horses judged on Friday, open class light horses judged on Tuesday and Wednesday, open class and 4-H FFA rabbit show on Tuesday. Sweepstakes – Saturday, 2:00 p.m. You have to provide a certificate of a clean flock or testing.
7. No exhibitor or his employee, or any persons shall at any time, without the permission of the management, lead or ride their animals from the barns to any place on the fair grounds where they may endanger pedestrians. Any infraction of this rule shall forfeit all premiums and shall be sufficient cause to have animals removed from the fair grounds.
8. All breeding animals over one year-old must be accompanied with certificate or registration in the exhibitor's names. Animals under one year of age must be properly identified as being eligible for registry by official identification for the breed (TATTOO).
9. No stalls or pens will be rented to any person or persons who have not made an entry for exhibit in the classes listed in this premium book.
10. Any exhibitor who fails to keep his stalls and animals neat and clean at all times may be asked by the superintendent to remove his exhibit and forfeit his premium. All animals must be registered in member's name and cannot be shown on another exhibitor's entry. Registration papers must be shown at time of entry.
11. Assignment of all stalls and pens will be made by the superintendent in charge on Saturday, July 24.

12. It is required that owners have general liability insurance coverage on animals being exhibited and that a certificate of insurance be given to Fair.
13. All livestock to be in place by 8:00 p.m. Monday, July 26 unless stated otherwise in Rules. Livestock release time is up to the Fair Board.
14. No drug testing for livestock done on fairgrounds.
