1. All exhibitors must submit their entries through the FairEntry online system by **Thursday, June 18, 2026. NO EXCEPTIONS!** All exhibitors will pay an entry fee of \$20 to the Announcers Stand on the fairgrounds. No premiums will be awarded. All stalls need to be cleaned before you leave the fairgrounds.
2. Entries are **limited to two animals** per exhibitor in any one class excluding Halter performance classes.
3. Ages of riders shall be computed from December 31, of the current year.
4. **Animals must always be led to and from wash and exercise areas and ridden only in the arenas. Horses are not to be ridden on any pavement.**
5. Horses will be released on **Wednesday, August 12**, one (1) hour after the completion of the last horse show. **Any horse NOT released on Wednesday, August 12, MUST stay until Saturday, August 15, no earlier than 8 p.m.**
6. Infractions of these and other barn rules directed by the superintendent in charge may result in dismissal of exhibitor and animal from the fairgrounds.
7. Proper attire and exhibitor number must be worn when showing.
8. **Enter at your own risk; all owners should have general liability insurance. The fair assumes no liability.**
9. We encourage decorating stalls. You are required to remove all material used for decorating, but not before 7:30 p.m. Saturday, August 15.
10. A current negative Coggins Test must be on file before the horse is unloaded.

Entry fee is \$15 per exhibitor, plus \$2 per stall fee. Entries must be paid in advance by Sunday, August 9, at 9 a.m. at the fair office.

All exhibitors must submit their entries through the FairEntry online system by **Sunday, May 31, 2026.**

1. Ages are computed from March 1 and September 1. (Example: junior calf born after March 1, 2026. No calves born after May 1, 2026, can be shown. Detailed ages are indicated in the Youth Dairy Section.)
2. A list of entries must be sent to the Superintendent by June 1, to reserve stall space. (Gary Protzman, 4141 Maxwell Rd., Caseville, MI 48725)
3. All cattle are to remain at the fair until 10 p.m. on Saturday.
4. 4-H and FFA animals cannot be shown on another exhibitor's entry.
5. All animals must have some identification papers to provide the age of animals and be available to be checked by the superintendent on the arrival of animals at the fairgrounds.
6. 4-H and FFA members can show grade animals in Open Class up to senior yearling that have been identified through the MSU Extension Office identification form which have been verified by a 4-H leader or Vo-Ag instructor two years and older, refer to Rule 5.
7. Entries in each department are to be listed on separate sheets with complete address and zip code.
8. A per head fee of \$2 to cover stall space is required. All entries and all stall rental fees must be paid in advance to qualify for exhibiting.
9. Dairy Exhibits are open to Huron County Residents Only.
10. Each exhibitor will be limited to 2 animals in one class.
11. Exhibitors are responsible for the final clean-up of stalls. The final clean-up must be done by 12 noon on Sunday at the end of the fair week. Stalls must be cleaned to the satisfaction of the superintendent. A fine will be assessed to be either deducted from the gallon of milk sale or paid before being allowed to show the following year. Not cleaning the stalls by exhibitors will be fined \$100 per individual animal.

3. Adults will pay an annual \$20 administrative fee to the Huron Community Fair when turning in their Premium Statements. (4-H Volunteers are exempt from this fee.)
4. All adults paying the annual administrative fee will receive a Fair Pass for the week of the Fair.
5. All entries must be owned/made by the exhibitor and not shown at previous fairs or other county fairs.
6. Adults can enter TWO projects per class in this Department.
7. **All nonperishable exhibits must be in the 4-H and FFA Building, Thursday, August 6, between 12 noon and 7 p.m.** These exhibits will be judged on Friday.
8. **Foods, plants (indoor/outdoor), flowers, vegetables & crops must be brought in between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. on Sunday, August 9, or between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. on Monday, August 10.**

9. The 4-H and FFA Building will be open to the public August 10 – August 14 from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m.; and on Saturday, August 15, from 11 a.m. to 7:45 p.m.
10. **Exhibits in the 4-H and FFA Building will be released on Saturday, August 15, between 8 p.m. and 9 p.m.** After 9 p.m. on Saturday, the 4-H Building will be open only under the supervision of fair management. (If you cannot be there on Saturday night to pick up your items, please plan with other families to pick up projects.)
